Delta Christian Community Food Pantry Annual Impact Report 2024-2025



During this past fiscal year:

- Volunteers Donated 7,216 hours
- Donations Received: \$26,000
- Average Number of Families Served each week: 160
- Average Number of Individuals Served each week: 475
- Total Number of Family Food Portions given: 8,400
- Total Pounds of Food Distributed: 502,110 lbs
- Annual Total Value of the Food Distributed: \$1,600,000+
- Annual Spend on Food Purchases: \$21,000
- Annual Operating Costs: \$16,500
- Free Market Guests Served: 142 families and 463 individuals

We serve three rural areas classified as "food deserts" meaning there is not access to nutritious, affordable food within a mile of where most residents live, and access is limited to mostly convenience stores. These towns include: Byron, Knightsen, and Bethel Island.

What does our food pantry mean for our clients?

- 1. ccess to meat, produce, and other pantry staples not always available nearby.
- 2. By receiving food they have more money in their pocket to spend on:
 - Rent, to keep them from being homeless.
 - Utilities, so they can stay warm in the winter and cooler in the summer, take a warm bath, and wash clothes.
 - Basic healthcare needs that we take for granted like soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothbrush and toothpaste, lotion, and medicines.
 - Gas for their vehicle, so they can get to a job or appointments and stores beyond their local neighborhood.
 - Phone services, so they can stay connected to others.
 - And more!
